Description: This tree is ' tall, consisting of a long straight trunk, ascending to spreading branches, and an oblongoid crown. The petiole and rachis central stalk of each leaflet is light green and generally glabrous; however, sometimes the base of the petiole is slightly hairy.

This species has very tough, durable wood that is used to make tool handles and Pignut Hickory prefers more open, well-drained areas; but similar to the Bitternut Hickory, the fruits are largely unpalatable, although they will still be eaten by some wild animals as a last resort.
